## **Three Types of Inbonds**

63- (IT) Immediate Transportation

62- (TE) Transportation & Exportation

63- (IE) Immediate Exportation

**IT** entries allows merchandise upon its arrival at a U.S. port to be transported to another U.S. port, where subsequent entry must be filed. (see 19 USC and 19 CFR 18.11)

**T&E** entries allows merchandise to entered at a U.S. port for transit through the United States to another U.S. port, where the merchandise is exported without payment of duties. (see 19 USC 1553 and 19 CFR 18.20)

**IE** entries allows cargo that has arrived at a U.S. port to be immediately exported from that same port without the payment of duties. (see 19 CFR 18.7 and 18.25)

example: a shipment can be moved from Canada to Pharr, TX but can't be exported.



example: a shipment moving from Canada to Pharr, TX; the shipment can be cancelled or exported.



example: an IT shipment is arrived in Pharr, TX to be exported to Mexico.

Different scenario, if shipment is arrived in Pharr, but will be exported through Brownsville, a TE would apply.
